Pineland Rd, Georgia Forestry Commission. Started on private land 13 miles northwest of Fargo, GA. Southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with backing, flanking and smoldering. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Area and road closures in effect.

Railroad, Florida Forest Service. Twelve miles north of Palatka, FL. Timber and southern rough. Moderate fire behavior with smoldering and backing. Railroad infrastructure threatened.

Sargent, National Forests in Florida, USFS. One mile south of Sargent, FL. Southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Railroad infrastructure threatened.

Cow Creek, Florida Forest Service. Ten miles south of Bronson, FL. Timber and southern rough. Moderate fire behavior with backing, flanking and creeping. Structures threatened. Trail closures in effect.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Breezy westerly winds 15-25 mph with gusts up to 35 mph amid relative humidity of 10-20% will develop across New Mexico into West Texas today, but recent rainfall will help to mitigate the conditions. Rain and snow will gradually end across Colorado and western Kansas today, while a cold front moves through the Northeast and Mid-Atlantic into the South. Scattered showers and thunderstorms will develop near and ahead of the front with wetting rain, and severe thunderstorms are likely in the Lower Mississippi Valley. Dry conditions will persist ahead of the front across Florida, with increasing southwesterly winds creating localized elevated conditions in the northern half of the state. Very warm temperatures will continue across the Northwest and northern Rockies and minimum relative humidity below 25% but winds will be light. Near to below normal temperatures are expected across Alaska with a few showers across south-central Alaska. Light sea breezes are expected across Hawai'i today, along with scattered showers favoring interior and leeward locations.
