**HWY 82**, Georgia Forestry Commission. Transfer of command from CIMT (SA Team 1) back to the local unit will occur tomorrow. Started on private land one mile east of Atkinson, GA. Southern rough, brush and grass. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

**Pineland Rd**, Georgia Forestry Commission. Started on private land 13 miles northwest of Fargo, GA. Southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with backing, flanking and smoldering. Numerous structures and critical infrastructure threatened. Area and road closures in effect.

**South Canal**, Florida Forest Service. Twelve miles south of Mayo, FL. Southern rough and timber. Active fire behavior with long-range spotting, running and group torching. Trail closures in effect.

\* **Lochloosa West**, Florida Forest Service. Twelve miles southeast of Gainesville, FL. Timber and southern rough. Active fire behavior with running, long-range spotting and group torching.

**Sargent**, National Forests in Florida, USFS. One mile south of Sargent, FL. Southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Railroad infrastructure threatened.

**Cow Creek**, Florida Forest Service. Ten miles south of Bronson, FL. Timber and southern rough. Moderate fire behavior with backing and flanking. Structures threatened. Trail closures in effect.

\* **Pelham 2**, North Carolina Forest Service. Two miles northwest of Watha, NC. Medium slash. Active fire behavior with running.

**N Main St 2**, Florida Forest Service. Two miles west of Gainesville, FL. Timber and southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering.

## **Predictive Services Discussion:**

A cold front will continue to move slowly through the Southeast today, with showers and thunderstorms near the front from the Lower Mississippi Valley into the Carolinas. However, how much rain makes it into the Florida Panhandle and South Georgia remains uncertain. In addition, breezy southwest winds 15-25 mph will develop ahead of the front across much of the Florida peninsula, with low relative humidity below 35% expected for northeast Florida creating elevated to critical conditions. Breezy and dry conditions will also develop behind the front in the Mid-Atlantic and Northeast, but recent precipitation will mitigate. In the Great Lakes, locally breezy west winds 12-20 mph will develop, strongest in Minnesota, with relative humidity falling to 15-25% in western Minnesota to eastern North Dakota creating areas of elevated conditions. Scattered light precipitation will fall in the northern Rockies today with a weak backdoor cold front, while the remainder of the West is dry. Above normal temperatures will persist across the Northwest into California and the Great Basin as minimum relative humidity falls below 25% but winds will be light. Below normal temperatures are expected across Alaska with scattered showers for the eastern half of the state. Light to moderate trade winds are expected across Hawai'i, with showers becoming focused to windward areas.
