South Canal, Florida Forest Service. Twelve miles south of Mayo, FL. Southern rough and timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering.

Sargent, National Forests in Florida, USFS. One mile south of Sargent, FL. Southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Railroad infrastructure threatened.

Cow Creek, Florida Forest Service. Started on private land 10 miles south of Bronson, FL. Timber and southern rough. Moderate fire behavior with backing, flanking and creeping. Structures threatened. Trail closures in effect.

Lochloosa West, Florida Forest Service. Started on private land 12 miles southeast of Gainesville, FL. Timber and southern rough. Moderate fire behavior with running, long-range spotting and group torching.

Pelham 2, North Carolina Forest Service. Two miles northwest of Watha, NC. Medium slash. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering.

N Main St 2, Florida Forest Service. Started on private land two miles west of Gainesville, FL. Timber and southern rough. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Temperatures 10-25oF above normal will occur across much of the West and extend into the northern Plains. Breezy south winds ahead of a cold front in the northern Plains and northwest winds behind it will gust to 45 mph amid relative humidity of 15-25% creating widespread elevated conditions. Locally elevated conditions are also likely to the east in portions of western Minnesota due to the breezy southerly winds ahead of the front although relative humidity will not be as low. In the West, relative humidity will fall to 5-15% from the Sierra Front to the central and southern Rockies, west of the Divide, but winds will be light overall. Scattered showers and thunderstorms will develop near the northern Gulf Coast today but will be less numerous than yesterday. Fewer showers are expected across southern Alaska today, with temperatures near normal. Breezy trade winds are expected across Hawai'i with isolated windward showers.
