Predictive Services Discussion:

Temperatures 10-30°F above normal will occur across much of the West, with daily record highs likely for some locations. Very low minimum relative humidity of 3-20% is expected across the Intermountain West although winds will be light overall. Isolated dry thunderstorms will develop in southeast Arizona into southwest New Mexico during the afternoon, and isolated dry thunderstorms are also possible this afternoon in northern California to southwest and extend into the northern Plains. Breezy Oregon. Tonight, scattered mixed wet and dry thunderstorms will develop near and west of the Cascades, with isolated thunderstorms also possible for the Inland Northwest into northwest Nevada. Farther east, dry and breezy northwest winds will develop across the eastern Dakotas into southwest Minnesota and western Iowa creating elevated conditions, while light rainfall moves through the Upper Great Lakes providing modest relief. Scattered showers and thunderstorms will develop across much of Florida today and provide some relief from the very dry conditions, but not all areas will receive rainfall. Cool conditions are expected across Alaska, with dry conditions for the Interior and scattered showers along the southern coast.
