## **Predictive Services Discussion:**

Dry conditions with low afternoon relative humidity 5-15% will continue across inland California into the Southwest, along with areas of poor overnight recovery for mid slopes and ridges. Dry and mild conditions are expected in the northern half of the West due to seasonal temperatures and light winds. A cold front will move through the northern High Plains into Wyoming, bringing scattered showers and thunderstorms, with snow in the highest elevations above 9,000 feet. Scattered showers and thunderstorms also persist across much of the central and southern Plains, bringing continued relief. Showers and thunderstorms will also stretch from the Lower Mississippi Valley into the Mid-Atlantic along a stalled cold front. Dry conditions will return to the Midwest, with breezy and dry southerly winds in western Minnesota creating locally elevated conditions. Dry and breezy northwest winds will develop across portions of northern New England, especially Maine, as well. Near to slightly below normal temperatures will continue across Alaska again today with isolated to scattered showers and an isolated thunderstorm or two across the Interior.
