Santa Rosa Island, Channel Islands National Park, NPS. Thirty-three miles southwest of Santa Barbara, CA. Brush, grass and chaparral. Moderate fire behavior with flanking, backing and creeping. Structures threatened. Area closures in effect.

Verona, Riverside Unit, Cal Fire. One mile northwest of Hemet, CA. Grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Trail closures in effect.

Bain, Riverside Unit, Cal Fire. One mile south of Jurupa Valley, CA. Brush and grass. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering.

Tusil, San Diego Unit, Cal Fire. Five miles northeast of Campo, CA. Chaparral, brush and grass. No new information.

* **Trigg**, Las Vegas District, NM State Forestry. Seventeen miles south of Mosquero, NM. Grass and brush. Active fire behavior with short-range spotting, running and wind-driven runs. Residences threatened. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

Hummingbird, Gila NF, USFS. Fifteen miles east of Glenwood, NM. Timber and medium slash. Minimal fire behavior. Area and trail closures in effect.

Cumulative acres shown in the Active Incident Resource Summary Table may not be reflected in the YTD statistics due to a lag in units completing YTD adjustments in the SIT/209 Application. Otherwise, changes in agency YTD fires and acres reflect more accurate mapping or reporting adjustments.

Predictive Services Discussion:

A pair of low pressure systems will progress across the central and eastern portions of the U.S. Saturday bringing showers & thunderstorms. One of the low pressure systems will spread from the South and Southeast U.S. northeastward to the East Coast states, eastern Great Lakes and southern New England. Significant rainfall amounts in the half inch to 2.5 inch range are expected across portions of the Gulf Coast states, Georgia and the Carolinas northward to New York, eastern Indiana, Ohio, Michigan, and New Jersey. Meanwhile, dry conditions persist further north across New England. The second low pressure system will drop more scattered and mostly lesser tenth to 1 inch amounts across Texas and the Southern & Central Plains north to Iowa, Minnesota & North Dakota. Mostly dry conditions are likely across the Western U.S. Dry and locally breezy conditions are likely across much of the Southwest & Great Basin with some valley minimum relative humidities in the single digits to teens & locally breezy conditions. Weak low pressure & instability is likely to lead to isolated mixed wet & dry afternoon to early evening thunderstorms across portions of Northern California, Southern Oregon, and Nevada.
