Predictive Services Discussion:

Red Flag Warnings for wind gusts up to 45 mph with low relative humidity in the teens are in effect for Monday across portions of northeast California, southeastern Oregon, and northwest Nevada as a low-pressure trough moves in from the northwest. Further west, west of the Cascades in Washington and Oregon, measurable rainfall with some wetting amounts of a quarter of an inch to an inch are expected. East of the Cascades & across much of the Great Basin and Desert Southwest minimum relative humidities will be mostly in the teens. Across the Rockies isolated to widely scattered mixed wet & dry thunderstorms are likely with the greatest coverage likely to be across northern Idaho and western Montana as well as across portions of central & eastern Arizona into New Mexico. Wetting rains of a quarter of an inch to an inch are likely across much of New Mexico. A swath of showers & thunderstorms is also expected along the Front Range of the Rockies & southern High Plains from New Mexico & Texas north to northeast across Nebraska & adjacent areas. Meanwhile, a slow-moving frontal system extending from the Gulf Coast northeastward into the Northeast is likely to bring widespread quarter of an inch amounts up to as much as 2 inches for most areas from the Southeast northward all the way across northern Maine.
