Numerous structures threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

Trigg, Las Vegas District, NM State Forestry. Seventeen miles south of Mosquero, NM. Grass and brush. Active fire behavior with wind-driven runs. Residences threatened.

Hummingbird, Gila NF, USFS. Fifteen miles east of Glenwood, NM. Timber and medium slash. Minimal fire behavior with creeping, backing and smoldering. Area and trail closures in effect.

Predictive Services Discussion:

A cold upper-level trough will continue to push into the Pacific Northwest and Great Basin Tuesday bringing cooler temperatures to the tune of 10-20 degrees Fahrenheit below normal. Areas of rain and mountain snow showers are expected with wetting amounts across portions of the Pacific Northwest into the Northern Rockies. Dry and breezy to windy conditions with minimum relative humidities in the teens and southwesterly gusts up to 55 mph are likely across the deserts of the Southwest northeastward into the 4 Corners region. Fire Weather Watches are in effect across portions of Southern Utah and southwestern Colorado. More showers and thunderstorms are likely across most of the Rockies, Front Range, Northern Plains and Upper Midwest eastward into parts of Minnesota and Wisconsin. However, a drier area is likely to develop across the Central Plains northwest into Montana. Fire weather headlines are in effect for gusty winds with low relative humidities across part of eastern Montana and western North Dakota. Meanwhile, copious amounts of moisture associated with a stationary front across Texas, the Lower Mississippi, Tennessee, and southern Ohio River valleys eastward into Florida and to the east coast of the Mid-Atlantic will bring more showers and thunderstorms with moderate to heavy rainfall there.
