Predictive Services Discussion:

A cold upper-level trough centered across California and Nevada Wednesday will continue to result in temperatures 10-20 degrees Fahrenheit below normal there and nearby. Areas of rain and mountain snow showers along with a few isolated thunderstorms are expected across northeast California, northwest Nevada, and parts of southern Oregon with precipitation amounts of a quarter of an inch to 1 inch likely. Scattered showers and a mix of wet and dry thunderstorms are likely from southeastern Oregon, across Idaho, and across much of Montana. Further south in the Great Basin, portions of southeast Nevada, northwest Arizona, and southwestern Utah, gusty winds with low relative humidity will bring a heightened risk of significant fire. It will also be dry and breezy to windy across much of the Southwest west of the Continental Divide. From the Divide east to the Front Range showers and isolated thunderstorms are likely, wettest across southeast Colorado into northeast New Mexico where a stalled frontal boundary will continue to focus low level moisture. Temperatures above normal by 10-20 degrees Fahrenheit are likely across the Northern Rockies, Northern Plains, and into the Upper Midwest. Southeasterly winds will again be breezy to windy with minimum relative humidities in the 15-25% range across portions of the northern Front Range and Northern Plains. A stalled front extending from the Southern Plains to Ohio Valley and Mid-Atlantic will bring more showers and thunderstorms along and south of it to the Gulf Coast and into parts of Florida with moderate to heavy rainfall amounts. Meanwhile, a mostly dry cold front will bring some late day cooling and northerly winds to Great Lakes and Northeast.
