Cumulative acres shown in the Active Incident Resource Summary Table may not be reflected in the YTD statistics due to a lag in units completing YTD adjustments in the SIT/209 Application. Otherwise, changes in agency YTD fires and acres reflect more accurate mapping or reporting adjustments.

Predictive Services Discussion:

A closed, cold upper-level low pressure system over California will bring well below normal temperatures and showers across California, southern Oregon, and western Nevada. Some high elevation snow is also likely in the Sierras, mainly above 8,000-foot elevations. On the northeast side of this low, showers and scattered thunderstorms are expected across the Pacific Northwest, into the northwestern Great Basin, and across Montana. Wetting precipitation amounts of a quarter of an inch up to 1.5 inches are likely across portions of central & southern Oregon, northern & central California, and part of far western Nevada. Well above normal temperatures are likely across the northern tier of the lower 48 states from Washington across the central & northern Rockies, across the Northern Plains, and into the Upper Midwest. Breezy to windy and dry conditions are likely across the Four Corners region. Remnants of a stalled front will bring some showers & thunderstorms along & near the Front Range of the Rockies, into portions of the central and southern Plains and into the Southeast to include Florida. Some half inch to 1.5-inch amounts are likely from Kansas to Arkansas, along the Gulf Coast, across Florida, and in northeastern North Carolina. Some light showers are expected across the Northeast as a cooler air mass moves in from Canada.
