Two 15-member incident management teams and 212 fireline personnel from Australia and New Zealand are assigned to support large fires in the Northwest and Great Basin geographic areas.

Two MAFFS C-130 airtankers from the 302nd Airlift Wing (Air Force Reserve, CO) and one from the 152nd Airlift Wing (NV Air National Guard), with respective support personnel, have been deployed to Santa Maria, CA. Two MAFFS C-130 airtankers and support personnel from the 146th Airlift Wing (CA Air National Guard) have been deployed to San Bernardino, CA to support wildland fire operations nationally.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Hot temperatures will continue across the southern Plains today with highs near 100°F, but relative humidity will be higher and generally above 20% along with lighter south winds of 5-15 mph. Dry and breezy west winds will continue across Wyoming today, while breezy west winds also occur in portions of central Montana. Lighter winds are expected elsewhere in the West, but temperatures will begin to warm, with temperatures mostly above normal along the West Coast and much of the Greater Four Corners. Scattered showers and thunderstorms will continue in along the Gulf Coast and across much of Florida, with scattered showers and thunderstorms developing in much of New Mexico, as well, then northeastward ahead of a cold front through the central Plains into the Great Lakes.
