Little Giant, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 13). CIMT is also managing the Sisi incident. Thirty miles northwest of Leavenworth, WA. Timber and dormant brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping, backing and smoldering. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Sisi, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Ten miles northwest of Stehekin, WA. Closed timber litter and timber. Active fire behavior with backing, flanking and isolated torching. Residences and energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Austin, Mt. Hood NF, USFS. CIMT (CA Team 2). CIMT is also managing the Narrows and Grasshopper incidents. Twenty-five miles southeast of Estacada, OR. Brush, timber and closed timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

The Narrows, Mt. Hood NF, USFS. Fifteen miles southeast of Estacada, OR. Grass, brush and light slash. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Grasshopper, Mt. Hood NF, USFS. Fourteen miles southwest of Dufur, OR. Brush, closed timber litter and timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and torching. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Three Queens, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Transfer of command from CIMT (NW Team 2) back to the local unit will occur today. CIMT is also managing the King and Goat incidents. Six miles east of Snoqualmie Pass, WA. Timber, brush and grass. Minimal fire behavior with creeping, isolated torching and smoldering. Numerous residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road and trail closures in effect.

King, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Seven miles northeast of Snoqualmie Pass, WA. Timber, brush and grass. Minimal fire behavior with creeping, smoldering and isolated torching. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Goat, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Fifteen miles north of Ronald, WA. Timber, brush and grass. Minimal fire behavior with creeping, isolated torching and smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Hagen, Umatilla NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 7). Twenty-six miles east of Pendleton, OR. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

Rowe Creek Complex, Prineville District, BLM. CIMT (ODF Team 1). Ten miles south of Fossil, OR. Grass, brush and timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering.

Sinlahekin, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. One mile west of Tonasket, WA. Timber, brush and grass. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Border 2, North Cascades National Park, NPS. Thirty-six miles northeast of Marblemount, WA. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with backing, flanking and creeping. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Paradise, Umatilla NF, USFS. Eighteen miles east of Milton-Freewater, OR. Timber, grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Critical infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Predictive Services Discussion:

The ridge of high pressure over the southeast will continue to weaken, but temperatures will still rise into the mid to upper 90s this afternoon from the lower Mississippi Valley north through Tennessee. Relative humidity will bottom out near 25-30% again today as well. In the Pacific Northwest, a trough aloft will bring breezy west winds gusting to 25 mph to cascade gaps and relative humidity will fall to 15-30% again this afternoon east of the Cascades. Further south, slightly above average temperatures are expected across northern California today along with breezy overnight winds and poor relative humidity recovery after RH falls to 10-20% this afternoon. Isolated mixed wet and dry thunderstorms will develop this afternoon across southern and western Nevada including across the Sierra Front. Isolated thunderstorms will also develop across the lower Mississippi Valley and across west Texas today, bring gusty outflow winds with them. Conditions trend drier across the desert southwest, though high temperatures remain mostly below normal. Today will be the driest day of the week across the southern Front Range with relative humidity dropping into the teens.
