Sisi, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Ten miles northwest of Stehekin, WA. Closed timber litter and timber. Active fire behavior with backing, flanking and isolated torching. Residences and energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Austin, Mt. Hood NF, USFS. CIMT (CA Team 2). CIMT is also managing the Narrows and Grasshopper incidents. Twenty-five miles southeast of Estacada, OR. Brush, timber and closed timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Grasshopper, Mt. Hood NF, USFS. Fourteen miles southwest of Dufur, OR. Brush, hardwood litter and closed timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Above normal temperatures will continue on the southern Plains to the Lower Mississippi Valley today but temperatures will not be as extreme as the past few weeks. Some locally low relative humidity near 30% is also expected in portions of northeast Texas into the Lower Mississippi Valley. Temperatures will also be a bit above normal in the northwestern U.S. with seasonally low relative humidity and light winds. Deep tropical moisture will continue to affect eastern Arizona into New Mexico and southern Colorado today with widespread showers and scattered thunderstorms, with areas of flooding likely near and east of the New Mexico central mountains. Scattered showers and thunderstorms will develop across the northern Plains today as a weak cold front moves through. Widespread showers will continue in the Mid-Atlantic today, but rainfall will not be as heavy as the past two days. Developing low pressure off the coast will also bring strong northeast winds to much of the East Coast from southern New England to the Carolinas.
