Little Giant, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 13). CIMT is also managing the Sisi incident. Thirty miles northwest of Leavenworth, WA. Timber and dormant brush. Minimal fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Sisi, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Ten miles northwest of Stehekin, WA. Closed timber litter and timber. Active fire behavior with backing, flanking and isolated torching. Residences and energy infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Austin, Mt. Hood NF, USFS. CIMT (CA Team 2). CIMT is also managing The Narrows and Grasshopper incidents. Twenty-five miles southeast of Estacada, OR. Brush, timber and closed timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

The Narrows, Mt. Hood NF, USFS. Fifteen miles southeast of Estacada, OR. Grass, brush and light slash. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Grasshopper, Mt. Hood NF, USFS. Fourteen miles southwest of Dufur, OR. Brush, hardwood litter and closed timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Hagen, Umatilla NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 7). Twenty-six miles east of Pendleton, OR. Timber and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Rowe Creek Complex, Prineville District, BLM. Transfer of command from CIMT (ODF Team 1) back to the local unit will occur tomorrow. Ten miles south of Fossil, OR. Grass, brush and timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering.

Three Queens, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Six miles east of Snoqualmie Pass, WA. Timber, brush and grass. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Numerous residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

King, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Seven miles northeast of Snoqualmie Pass, WA. Timber, brush and grass. Moderate fire behavior with backing and creeping. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Goat, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Fifteen miles north of Ronald, WA. Timber, brush and grass. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Predictive Services Discussion:

An upper level trough will move eastward over the northwest today, bringing southwest winds 15-20 mph with higher gusts along with afternoon relative humidity in the 15-25% range across northeastern California and southeastern Oregon. Higher winds with 25-35 mph gusts are expected across northwestern Nevada including the Sierra Front and western Idaho in combination with RH values of 12-18%. Above normal temperatures continue across the southern Plains and lower Mississippi Valley along with seasonably low RH and locally breezy north winds. Heavy rain at times along with cloud cover and near to below normal temperatures will continue across the desert Southwest. A strong Nor'easter will continue to bring strong winds, heavy rain, and coastal flooding to the mid-Atlantic coast. In Hawaii, Tropical Depression 15-E, forecasted to become Hurricane Nolo will begin to track northward toward the Big Island, bringing heavy rain, flash flooding concerns, and strong winds.
