Minimal fire behavior with creeping, backing and smoldering. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

Sisi, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Ten miles northwest of Stehekin, WA. Closed timber litter and timber. Moderate fire behavior with backing, flanking and creeping. Residences threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

Austin, Mt. Hood NF, USFS. CIMT (CA Team 2). CIMT is also managing The Narrows and Grasshopper incidents. Twenty-five miles southeast of Estacada, OR. Brush, timber and closed timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

The Narrows, Mt. Hood NF, USFS. Fifteen miles southeast of Estacada, OR. Grass, brush and light slash. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

Grasshopper, Mt. Hood NF, USFS. Fourteen miles southwest of Dufur, OR. Brush, hardwood litter and closed timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Precipitation occurred over the fire area yesterday.

Hagen, Umatilla NF, USFS. Transfer of command from CIMT (NW Team 7) back to the local unit will occur tomorrow. Twenty-six miles east of Pendleton, OR. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Three Queens, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Six miles east of Snoqualmie Pass, WA. Timber, brush and grass. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Numerous residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Sinlahekin, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. One mile west of Tonasket, WA. Timber, brush and grass. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Above normal temperatures will persist across the southern Plains into the Lower Mississippi Valley today, with areas of low afternoon relative humidity as low as 25% but winds will be light. In the West, temperatures will average below normal as winds are mostly light, with areas of low afternoon relative humidity in central and southern California into Nevada. Scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms will develop later in the day across the Southwest as moisture from Hurricane Polo off the Mexico coast moves northward. Isolated showers and thunderstorms will also develop in the Lower Mississippi Valley, while rain occurs along a cold front in the northern Plains. Heavy rain is expected in much of southern and eastern New England today as the strong Nor'easter continues to affect the areas, with strong northeast winds and coastal flooding continuing, as well. Winds will slowly weaken in Hawai'i as Hurricane Nolo moves westward away from the islands, with a decrease in showers also expected.
