Little Giant, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. CIMT (NW Team 13). CIMT is also managing the Sisi incident. Thirty miles northwest of Leavenworth, WA. Timber and dormant brush. Minimal fire behavior with backing, creeping and smoldering. Structures threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Sisi, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Ten miles northwest of Stehekin, WA. Closed timber litter and timber. Moderate fire behavior with backing, creeping and flanking. Residences threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Austin, Mt. Hood NF, USFS. CIMT (CA Team 2). CIMT is also managing The Narrows and Grasshopper incidents. Twenty-five miles southeast of Estacada, OR. Brush, timber and closed timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

The Narrows, Mt. Hood NF, USFS. Fifteen miles southeast of Estacada, OR. Grass, brush and light slash. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Grasshopper, Mt. Hood NF, USFS. Fourteen miles southwest of Dufur, OR. Brush, hardwood litter and closed timber litter. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering and creeping. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Hagen, Umatilla NF, USFS. Transfer of command from CIMT (NW Team 7) back to the local unit will occur today. Twenty-six miles east of Pendleton, OR. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Three Queens, Okanogan-Wenatchee NF, USFS. Six miles east of Snoqualmie Pass, WA. Timber, brush and grass. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Numerous residences and critical infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Sinlahekin, Northeast Region, Washington DNR. One mile west of Tonasket, WA. Timber, brush and grass. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Area, road and trail closures in effect.

Second Street, Washington State Fire Marshal's Office. One mile southeast of Benton City, WA. Grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Last report unless significant activity occurs.

Predictive Services Discussion:

Above normal temperatures will persist across the southern Plains into the Lower Mississippi Valley today, but light southerly flow off the Gulf will bring additional low level moisture with minimum relative humidity forecast to remain above 35%. In addition, isolated showers and thunderstorms in the afternoon and evening will produce localized wetting rain. Drier conditions with minimum relative humidity of 25-35% will persist in the Southeast. In the West, abundant moisture from Hurricane Polo will move into the Southwest with widespread showers, scattered thunderstorms, and localized flooding. Scattered showers and thunderstorms are also likely to develop farther to the north and east into the central Rockies and much of the central and northern Plains. Farther west, dry conditions are expected for California, the western Great Basin, Northwest, and northern Rockies, amid below normal temperatures. Rain and wind will diminish in the Northeast today, with drier conditions and moderate trade winds in Hawai'i.
