## IMSR Update (Julie Polutnik)

PL2, light IA, 203 fires, 5 uncontained large fires, 1 NIMO Team, 41 engines, 4 helicopters, and 863 personnel committed.

**Northwest:** PL1, light IA, 2 uncontained large fires.

Sunny Side – BIA, light fuels, active behavior, light fuels, structures threatened, 650 acres, 0% contained.

Firewater – Active behavior, grass, residences threatened, 1,500 acres, 0% contained.

Northern Rockies: PL1, light IA.

Banana Lake – 833 acres, 100% contained.

Great Basin: PL1, 29 new fires.

Hag – Hill AF Base, 9,200 acres, 100% contained.

Southern Area: PL1, light IA, 31 new fires, 1 uncontained large fire.

Perchman – Minimal behavior, southern rough and brush, 849 acres, 90% contained.

Eastern Area: PL2, light IA, 1 uncontained large fire, 1 NIMO Team.

Jenkins Creek – NIMO Team 1, minimal behavior, brush and timber, received precipitation, 16,100 acres, 94% contained.

Southwest: PL2, moderate IA, 15 new fires, 1 uncontained large fire.

Ranch – AZ DOF, minimal behavior, light fuels, 2,700 acres, 70% contained.

### **Predictive Services Update**

#### Weather Summary (Jim Wallmann)

#### **WEATHER SUMMARY**

#### Short-term (through Friday)

- Above normal temperatures for northern California and the northern half of the West into midweek, with isolated to scattered mixed wet/dry thunderstorms followed by areas of breezy winds mid to late week
- An increase in initial attack is expected with areas of moderate significant fire potential but a significant increase in activity is not expected
- Isolated mixed wet/dry thunderstorms for the Four Corners and Southwest near the Divide through midweek with moderate significant fire potential near/south of the Rim
- · Another round of wetting rain is unlikely for northern Minnesota, but RH will remain elevated
- · A wetter period is likely midweek for the Texas Hill Country and Florida reducing fire potential
- Turning warm and dry for much of Alaska late this week, with well above normal temperatures increasingly likely this weekend

#### Long-term (Saturday through next Wednesday)

- Hot and dry for the Southwest and Greater Four Corners into mid-next week with an increasing footprint of moderate significant fire potential, but without weather triggers a more rapid rise in fire activity is not expected
- · Cooler and breezy at times for the northern half of the West and California, with low fire potential
- . Turning drier for the southern Plains and Florida, but significant fire potential will remain low
