PL2, light IA, 400 new starts, 16 uncontained large fires, 2 CIMTs, 1 T1 IMT, 78 crews, 196 engines, 35 helicopters, 3,550 personnel assigned.

1 LAT, 3 IMTs, 15 crews, and 73 personnel assigned to Canada.

Northwest: PL2, light IA, 4 uncontained large fires, 1 T1 IMT.

Pomas – Active behavior, slash and brush, 150 acres, 0% contained.

Rowena – ODF Team 2, moderate behavior, light fuels and timber, residences threatened, structures lost, evacuations, 3,550 acres, 24% contained.

Ferry – Minimal behavior, light fuels, structures and infrastructure threatened, 10,400 acres, 78% contained. Sunny Side – Light fuels, 755 acres, 80% contained.

South Ops: PL2, heavy IA, 66 new starts, 1 uncontained large fire.

Ranch – Cal Fire, minimal behavior, light fuels, structures threatened, 4,300 acres, 85% contained.

Bitter – 1,600 acres, 100% contained.

Weather Summary (Jim Wallmann)

WEATHER SUMMARY

Short-term (through Friday)

- Hot temperatures will continue over the Southwest, California and the Great Basin with very low RH early in the week
- Periods of breezy winds across Northwest, southern California, Great Basin, and Southwest, continuing into Tuesday for the Southwest
- After brief cooling across the West, above normal temperatures and low RH return for the middle of the week
- · A second chance for high winds across most of the Intermountain West occurs Thursday and Friday
- An extended period of warm conditions and low RH will continue in Alaska with isolated thunderstorms, and significant fire potential will increase to moderate for much of the eastern half of the state

Long-term (Saturday through next Wednesday)

- Strong winds low RH in the southern/eastern Great Basin, Southwest, and West Slope Saturday, with breezy conditions likely to continue through midweek and moderate to high-risk significant fire potential
- Breezy north winds for northern California this weekend, followed by mild and very dry conditions for central/northern California into mid-next week
- Cooler for the northern half of the West, with wetting precipitation most likely for the Cascades and northern Rockies near the Canadian border
- · Hot for the East, with fire potential highest in Florida and the pine barrens of the Mid-Atlantic
