PL3, light IA, 23 uncontained large fires, 9 CIMTs, 285 engines, 55 helicopters, 136 crews, 5,992 personnel assigned.

3 short IMTs, 107 OH, 17 crews assigned to Canada.

Northwest: PL2, 5 new starts, 3 uncontained large fires.

Barstow Road – WA state, 2,000 acres.

Pomas – Active behavior, slash and brush, 1,300 acres, 0% contained.

Upper Applegate – OR DOF, minimal behavior, timber, structures threatened, 468 acres, 0% contained.

Alder Springs – Timber and light fuels, 3,300 acres, 82% contained.

South Ops: PL2, moderate to heavy IA, 1 uncontained large fire.

Monte – Minimal behavior, light fuels, 1,000 acres, 90% contained.

Northern Rockies: PL2, no new starts, 3 uncontained large fires, 2 CIMTs.

Jericho Mountain – NR Team 6, minimal behavior, timber, structures threatened, 350 acres, 0% contained.

Post – NR Team 5, minimal behavior, timber, 144 acres, 80% contained.

Alaska: PL4, moderate to heavy IA, 9 uncontained large fires, 2 CIMTs.

Himalaya Road – SW Team 3 mobilizing, extreme behavior, grass and timber, residences threatened, evacuations, 3,000 acres, 0% contained.

Aggie Creek – AK DOF, active behavior, timber, residences threatened, 1,000 acres, 0% contained.

Seven Mile Lookout – Active behavior, timber, residences threatened, evacuations, 1,200 acres, 0% contained.

Nelchina Glacier – Active behavior, timber, structures threatened, 1,500 acres, 0% contained.

Southwest: PL3, 8 new starts, 3 uncontained large fires, 3 CIMTs.

Trout – SW Team 4, active behavior, light fuels and timber, communities and infrastructure threatened, 46,700 acres, 22% contained.

Weather Summary (Scott Stearns)

WEATHER SUMMARY

Short-term (through Friday)

- Warm, dry, and windy conditions continue over portions of the Great Basin, Four Corners and Southwest through much of the week
- Monsoon moisture continues across central and eastern New Mexico with thunderstorms mainly east of the Divide this week
- · A heat wave continues for the eastern US through mid-week
- · A slow but steady warming trend will set in across the Northwest
- Temperatures will moderate slightly, but remain above normal, with increased chances of precipitation (including additional thunderstorm activity) over Alaska this week
- Fire potential increases over portions of the far southeast through the week, with potential highest in Florida

Long-term (Saturday through next Wednesday)

- Above normal temperatures for the West with low RH and fair to poor overnight recovery for mid-slopes and ridges
- An increase in winds possible for the Great Basin mid-next week, along with isolated mixed wet/dry thunderstorms for the northern Intermountain West
- Monsoon moisture to continue near/east of the Divide in Colorado and New Mexico, but isolated mixed wet/dry thunderstorms are possible from eastern Arizona to the West Slope
- Relief likely for Florida due to scattered showers and thunderstorms, while the southern Plains continue to dry but significant fire potential remains low, for now
