# IMSR Update (Kat Sorenson)

PL3, light IA, 31 uncontained large fires, 8 CIMTs, 6,080 personnel assigned. 3 IMTs, 8 crews, 88 overhead assigned to Canada.

Northwest: PL2, 12 new fires, 4 uncontained large fires. Pomas – Active behavior, heavy slash and brush, 1,500 acres, 0% contained. Barstow Road – Minimal behavior, light fuels, structures threatened, 1,500 acres, 93% contained.

Northern Rockies: PL2, light IA, 2 uncontained large fires, 1 CIMT. Jericho Mountain – NR Team 6, minimal behavior, timber, structures threatened, 369 acres, 0% contained. Post – Returned to local unit, minimal behavior, timber, 144 acres, 94% contained. Wolf Syrup – 140 acres, 100% contained.

Great Basin: PL3, 4 uncontained large fires, 2 CIMTs.

Forsyth – GB Team 7, active behavior, timber and brush, Pine Valley community threatened, 8,200 acres, 0% contained.

France Canyon – GB Team 5, active behavior, timber, Hatch community and infrastructure threatened, 25,550 acres, 5% contained.

Horse - Moderate behavior, timber, structures threatened, 2,200 acres, 20% contained.

Southern Area: PL1, 14 new fires, 2 fires burning in FL.

Rocky Mountain: PL2 tomorrow morning.

Alaska: PL4, light IA, 15 uncontained large fires, 2 CIMTs.

Himalaya Road – AK DOF, SW Team 3, managing Aggie Creek, moderate behavior, chapparal and timber, residences threatened, evacuations, 3,400 acres, 0% contained.

Aggie Creek – AK DOF, minimal behavior, chaparral and timber, residences threatened, evacuations, 2,600 acres, 0% contained.

Bear Creek – AK DOF, AK Team 1, moderate behavior, timber, structures threatened, evacuations, 26,000 acres, 0% contained.

Southwest: PL3, 6 new fires, 4 uncontained large fires, 3 CIMTs.

Trout – SW Team 4, minimal behavior, light fuels and timber, communities and infrastructure threatened, 47,100 acres, 41% contained.

Seven Springs – SW Team 1 TOC local unit today, minimal behavior, grass and timber, 805 acres, 91% contained.

Bridge Creek – SW Team 2 TOC local unit today, minimal behavior, timber and brush, 2,278 acres, 0% completed.

#### Weather Summary (Jim Wallmann)

# WEATHER SUMMARY

#### Short-term (through Sunday)

- A warming trend is expected for California and the northern half of the West, with temperatures 5-15°F above normal this weekend
- Breezy westerly winds for the Cascade gaps, Columbia Basin, and Sierra Front through tomorrow creating locally elevated conditions
- Monsoon showers and thunderstorms to continue for most of New Mexico and portions of far southeast
  Arizona
- Isolated to scattered thunderstorms return to much of the Southeast today through the weekend, but will
  continue elevated initial attack the next couple days in the Carolinas and Florida, with high-risk significant
  fire potential today in the Carolinas
- Cool, moist easterly flow will continue in Alaska with areas of wetting rain and moderated conditions through the weekend

#### Long-term (Monday through next Friday)

- Above normal temperatures for the West with low RH and fair to poor overnight recovery for mid-slopes and ridges, especially for the Great Basin through mid-next week
- Isolated to scattered mixed wet/dry thunderstorms likely for northern California into the Inland Northwest, northern Great Basin, and northern Rockies increasing initial attack, with the greatest potential for significant fires in northern California to the northern Great Basin
- Monsoon showers and thunderstorms will continue in New Mexico, spreading into eastern Arizona and the Four Corners later next week
- Modest relief continues for Florida, but is more uncertain for the coastal Carolinas, while much of Texas
  continues the drying trend

#### **Fuels Summary (Steve Larrabee)**

Live fuels in AZ have trended and stayed below the average.

Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory for Southeast AZ renewed yesterday.

Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory for Gila/White Mountains in effect.

Elevated ERCs extending up into GB and RM areas and at lower elevations in CA.

#### International

Saskatchewan requesting 2-7 days extension for crews. Recommend 7-day extension for all 5 crews. -Support

#### Teams

SW requesting 3-day extension for SW Team 4 on Trout. -Support

When short teams return from Canada, does the CIMT need 7 days of unavailability?

-No, the assignment does not count against the team.

Consider each GACC have one or two placeholders for "GA International IMT" in IROC for roster filling and cleaner data.

Official RFAs were for Canada T2 IMT, some positions are equivalent to US T3 positions rather than CIMT qualifications.

Team personnel mobilized to Canada should adhere to overhead assignment work-rest guidelines after demobilizing back to US. -Support

Revisit terminology for mobilizing non-standard CIMTs.

A GA filling an international team request does not count against the GA's national rotation slot. Revisit Friday, June 27.

Draft memo language on Friday clarifying CIMT usage and non-standard mobilizations.

#### **Incident Procurement**
