PL4. Light IA. 10 new large fires. 32 uncontained large fires. 12 CIMTs and 1 NIMO assigned. 2 MAFFS assigned in Klamath Falls. 261 crews, 521 engines, 115 helicopters and 11,859 assigned.

North Ops: PL3. 3 unstaffed fires. 3 uncontained large fires. 2 CIMTs assigned.

Orleans Complex: CA Team 4 assigned. Moderate behavior. Infrastructure threatened. Evacuations in place.

34% contained. Expected containment: mid-August.

Mammoth Fire: Minimal behavior. 3,100 acres. 42% contained. Expected containment: 7/31.

Green Fire: 80% contained. Expected containment: 7/31.

Northwest: PL3. Light IA. 1 new large fire. 8 uncontained large fires. 4 CIMTs and 1 NIMO assigned.

Burdoin Fire: Minimal behavior. No growth in the last 48 hours. 54% contained. 11,300 acres.

<u>Lake Spokane Fire:</u> Minimal behavior. 0 acres of growth. 2,550 acres. 52% contained.

Pomas Fire: NW Team 10 assigned. 3,500 acres. 45% contained.

South Rim Fire: Minimal behavior. 41% contained.

Vees Fire: Extreme behavior. Structures threatened. 3,000 acres. 0% contained.

Tower 2 Fire: Active behavior. 150 acres. 20% contained.

War Creek Fire: 2,250 acres.

Alaska: PL3. Demobilizing on several fires.

Southwest: PL3. Light IA. 6 uncontained large fires. 3 CIMTs assigned.

Weather Summary (Jim Wallmann)

WEATHER SUMMARY

Short-term (through Wednesday)

- · Increased temperatures in the northwestern US through midweek with isolated to scattered thunderstorms becoming drier
- The day of greatest coverage and area expanse is expected Wednesday, with significant initial attack expected and moderate to high-risk significant fire potential
- · Very dry conditions continue for much of the Great Basin, Arizona, and central Rockies, with areas of breezy winds for eastern Nevada and western Utah creating locally elevated conditions
- The monsoon remains weak, with thunderstorms mostly east of the Divide in Colorado/New Mexico with a threat of dry thunderstorms on the western fringe from the Mogollon Rim to the West Slope
- · Alaska will turn cooler with scattered showers


Long-term (Thursday through next Wednesday)

- Mixed wet/dry thunderstorms are likely for Arizona, eastern Utah, and the West Slope late this week, followed by the monsoon taking another extended break for the Southwest this weekend into next week
- · Periods of breezy winds are likely this weekend into early next week for the Great Basin, Arizona, and central Rockies amid very low RH and poor overnight recovery
- · Thunderstorms continue in the northwestern US through Friday, followed by cooler and occasionally breezy conditions and low to moderate significant fire potential
- · Overall fire potential will gradually increase across the West, with the greatest concern in the Great Basin and
