PL3, light IA, 157 new starts, 39 uncontained large fires, 7 CIMTs, 242 crews, 575 engines, 112 helicopters, 11,287 personnel assigned.

North Ops: PL3, moderate IA, 29 new starts, 4 uncontained large fires, 1 CIMT.

Orleans Complex – CA Team 4, includes Butler and Big Cliff incidents, active behavior, timber and brush, structures threatened, 21,000 acres, 81% contained.

Lake – Active behavior, light fuels, 340 acres, 0% contained.

Northwest: PL3, moderate IA, 34 new starts, 6 uncontained large fires, 2 CIMTs.

Bear Creek II: BIA, WA, NW Team 3 mobilizing, 80 acres, managing 4 additional incidents in Complex. Bear Gulch – NW Team 7, active behavior, timber, residences threatened, evacuations, 4,700 acres, 3% contained.

Pomas – NW Team 10 TOC local unit tomorrow, minimal behavior, timber and grass, infrastructure threatened, 3,400 acres, 0% contained.

South Ops: PL3, moderate IA, 25 new starts, 1 uncontained large fire, 1 CIMT.

Gifford – CA Team 5, active behavior, light fuels, residences and infrastructure threatened, evacuations, 49,761 acres, 3% contained.

Northern Rockies: PL2, light IA, 16 new starts, 1 uncontained large fire.

Lightning Creek – Active behavior, slash and timber, 1,500 acres, 0% completed.

Great Basin: PL3, light IA, 17 new starts, 8 uncontained large fires, 1 CIMT.

Monroe Canyon – GB Team 5, active behavior, brush and timber, communities and infrastructure threatened, habitat threatened, evacuations, 62,710 acres, 13% contained.

Jakes – Extreme behavior, light fuels, community and infrastructure threatened, habitat threatened, 3,271 acres, 13% contained.

Snowstorm – Extreme behavior, light fuels, residences and habitat threatened, 22,256 acres, 5% contained.

MP 22 – Moderate behavior, light fuels, residences and habitat threatened, 4,230 acres, 42% contained.

Adobe Mountain – Extreme behavior, structures and habitat threatened, 5,500 acres, 0% contained.

Rocky Mountain: PL3, moderate IA, 5 uncontained large fires, 1 CIMT.

Lee and Grease – Merged, T3 IMT mobilizing, 2,000 acres.

Elk RBX – RM Team 3 mobilizing, active behavior, brush, residences threatened, evacuations, 2,500 acres, 0% contained.

Turner Gulch- NR Team 2, moderate behavior, brush and timber, residences threatened, 22,053 acres, 49% contained.

Logan Mountain – Minimal behavior, timber and grass, 194 acres, 30% contained.

Southwest: PL3, light IA, 13 new starts, 9 uncontained large fires, 1 CIMT.

Dragon Bravo – SW Team 2, active behavior, brush and timber, structures and infrastructure threatened, 116,592 acres, 12% contained.

Middle Mesa – Active behavior, ordering CIMT, timber, structures and infrastructure threatened, 2,036 acres, 0% contained.

Bronco – BIA, extreme behavior, light fuels, residences threatened, 500 acres, 0% contained.

Weather Summary (Alex Melitsis)

WEATHER SUMMARY

Short-term (through Wednesday)

- Isolated mixed wet/dry thunderstorms for the northwestern US today, however the threat of lightning and new
 ignitions is lees likely on Tuesday and Wednesday.
- Very dry conditions continue for much of the Great Basin, inland southwest, and central Rockies, with areas of
 hot, dry, and breezy winds for eastern Nevada, Utah, the West Slope, and northern Arizona expected to
 continue, creating elevated conditions and high-risk significant fire potential for much of the coming week.
- The monsoon remains weak, however minimal monsoonal moisture may move across the Southwest over the coming days, bringing the threat of dry thunderstorms to parts of Arizona, western New Mexico, western Colorado.
- · Interior Alaska will remain warm and dry for most of the week, but significant fire potential remains low overall

Long-term (Thursday through next Wednesday)

- Strong winds, very low RH, and very long burn periods for the Great Basin, central Rockies, and northern Arizona through Friday creating widespread moderate to high-risk significant fire potential
- Isolated mixed wet/dry thunderstorms and strong outflows for the southern half of Arizona and near/east of the Divide in New Mexico into early next week
- · Hot and dry for California for into early next week and possibly beyond increasing significant fire potential
- Wetting rain for portions of western Washington and the northern Rockies Thursday followed by a warming and drying trend, but how significant it will be remains uncertain
