Mountain – Minimal behavior, light fuels, structures and infrastructure threatened, 980 acres, 50% contained. Orleans Complex – 2 fires, minimal behavior, timber and brush, structures threatened, 22,139 acres, 84% contained.

Northwest: PL3, moderate IA, 25 new starts, 4 uncontained large fires, 3 CIMTs.

Central Ferry – WA Fire Marshall, 1,500 acres.

Crescent Road – DNR, extreme behavior, timber, structures threatened, 800 acres, 0% contained.

## **Predictive Services Update**

Weather Summary (Jim Wallmann)

## **WEATHER SUMMARY**

### Short-term (through Saturday)

- High-risk significant fire potential today for much of the Great Basin and central Rockies due to mixed wet/dry
  lightning and breezy southwest winds continuing the escalation in activity that began yesterday
- Gradually cooler conditions in the Northwest and California into the weekend, with higher RH as well
- An atmospheric river will bring heavy rain to western Washington through tomorrow, with scattered wetting rain for western Oregon, northern Washington and northern Idaho Saturday
- · A surge in monsoon moisture tomorrow will temporarily moderate conditions for Arizona, Utah, and Colorado
- Breezy for the southern Plains, strongest Saturday, while dry conditions persist for the Northeast

#### Long-term (Sunday through next Saturday)

- . Monsoon moisture wanes early to mid-next week but is expected to return to Arizona late next week
- Above normal temperatures are expected across much of the West mid to late next week, especially for the northern two-thirds of the Intermountain West
- How far north the monsoon moisture moves is uncertain, which will have an impact on significant fire potential in the Great Basin and central Rockies
- Lighter winds for the southern Plains after Sunday, with a chance of thunderstorms at times next week, but widespread wetting rain is not expected, while the Northeast remains dry overall
- Impacts from Tropical Storm Erin remain uncertain and depend on where recurvature occurs, but increased swells are surf are likely at a minimum



Another day of significant initial attack and emerging large fires today due to dry lightning and breezy southwest winds, focused on the Great Basin, central Rockies, and southwest Montana. Conditions will moderate tomorrow into the weekend.

## **Fuels Summary (Steve Larrabee)**

Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory updated to cover Utah, AZ Strip, W Colorado, and SW Wyoming. Highest ERCs are focused on Intermountain West.

Observed fuels flammability and fire behavior in NR is greater than NFDRS metrics would suggest.
