Weather Summary (Jim Wallmann)

WEATHER SUMMARY

Short-term (through Thursday)

- Continued hot, dry, and unstable for Washington, western Oregon and the northern Rockies today with isolated mixed wet/dry thunderstorms possible in the Cascades and pyroCbs possible on any very active fires
- Deep monsoon moisture continues for eastern Oregon, southern Idaho, and Wyoming southward with mainly scattered wet thunderstorms, with the most widespread rain into Wednesday for eastern Nevada, Utah, central/southern Idaho, western Wyoming
- · A drying trend begins afterward with few thunderstorms expected in California and the Southwest Thursday
- Continued dry for the Northeast and Mid-Atlantic, with localized relief in Texas but most areas will remain dry while relief from the recent dry conditions is expected in the Mississippi Valley

Long-term (Friday through next Thursday)

- A return to drier conditions is most likely across much of the West with the monsoon most likely to affect southeast Arizona and near/east of the Divide in Colorado and New Mexico
- Significant uncertainty next week with the evolution of the upper-level ridge but temperatures are most likely to be above normal for California and the Northwest
- Any additional thunderstorm potential to the north and west will depend on the ridge evolution, as well as temperatures for most of the Intermountain West
- · After a brief period of rain for the Northeast Saturday, dry conditions return, with the Mid-Atlantic also dry
