# **IMSR Update (Megan Kephart)**

PL4, light IA, 72 new starts, 52 uncontained large fires, 18 CIMTs, 6 Army Medivac helicopters, 445 crews, 1,025 engines, 117 helicopters, 20,468 personnel assigned.

**North Ops:** PL3, 4 new starts, 6 uncontained large fires, 2 CIMTs.

Blue – CA Team 1 TOC CA Team 6 today, managing Dillon and Log, minimal behavior, timber, 3,600 acres, 54% contained.

Northwest: PL4, 12 new starts, 23 uncontained large fires, 10 CIMTs.

Lower Sugarloaf – NW Team 3, managing Labor Mountain, moderate behavior, timber, structures threatened, evacuations, received precipitation, 14,000 acres, 0% contained.

Labor Mountain – Active behavior, timber and brush, structures threatened, evacuations, 3,200 acres, 0% contained.

Wildcat – NW Team 10, moderate behavior, timber, structures threatened, evacuations, 7,800 acres, 8% contained.

Crown Creek – WA DNR, NW Team 12, managing Katy Creek, moderate behavior, timber and brush, residences threatened, evacuations, 14,100 acres, 20% contained.

Katy Creek – Active behavior, timber and brush, structures threatened, evacuations, 3,400 acres, 5% contained.

Rattlesnake – NW Team 7, managing Lynx Mountain, active behavior, timber and light fuels, residences threatened, evacuations, 19,367 acres, 50% contained.

Lynx Mountain – Actie behavior, slash and brush, residences threatened, evacuations, 4,500 acres, 6% contained.

Tacoma Creek – GB Team 7, active behavior, timber, structures threatened, evacuations, 4,000 acres, 0% contained.

Mark's Creek – ODF Team 2 TOC local unit tomorrow, minimal behavior, timber, residences threatened, evacuations, 1,700 acres, 72% contained.

Bridge – CA Team 4, minimal behavior, timber, structures threatened, evacuations, received precipitation, 350 acres, 44% contained.

Emigrant – CA Team 3, minimal behavior, slash and timber, received precipitation, 32,294 acres, 2% contained. Moon Complex – GB Team 5, minimal behavior, timber, structures threatened, evacuations, 3,200 acres, 4% contained.

Kelsey Peak – ODF Team 1, minimal behavior, timber, evacuations, received precipitation, 1,000 acres, 15% contained.

South Ops: PL4, 11 new starts, 5 uncontained large fires, 2 CIMTs.

Garnet – CA Team 5, active behavior, timber, structures threatened, evacuations, 56,795 acres, 15% contained. Salt – Cal Fire Team 1, minimal behavior, grass and timber, structures threatened, evacuations, 25,580 acres, 71% contained.

Northern Rockies: PL3, 16 new starts, 10 uncontained large fires, 3 CIMTs.

Windy Rock – NR Team 1, moderate behavior, grass and timber, residences threatened, evacuations, 6,000 acres, 26% contained.

## Weather Summary (Gina McGuire)

#### **WEATHER SUMMARY**

#### Short-term (through Saturday)

- Cool temperatures, higher RH, scattered showers and thunderstorms and wetting rain for much of the Intermountain West with drier and warmer weather moving into the Northwest and western Great Basin Friday/Saturday.
- Strong south to southwest winds and dry conditions today across the eastern Great Basin, Southwest and central Rockies and from West Texas into the Central Plains through the weekend.
- Hotter and drier for the Plains into the East, with the hottest temperatures from the southern Plains across the Mississippi Valley where record heat may occur.
- · Showers and thunderstorms continue in Florida and Coastal East.

#### Long-term (Sunday through next Saturday)

- · Continued cool in the Rockies through Sunday, while scattered showers and thunderstorms move into the Plains.
- A second low to move into the Northwest Sunday, then potentially slow as it tracks across the northern Great
  Basin and northern Rockies through early next week. Another round of precipitation is likely in the Northwest
  Sunday and across the northern Rockies into early next week with potentially season-slowing/ending conditions.
- Hot and continued dry conditions for the Mid/Lower Mississippi and Ohio Valley into the Southeast through mid-week, with near record heat in the Mississippi Valley.
- Breezy southerly winds from Texas into the Central Plains this weekend.

Fire indices across the West are at or below normal for this time of year. Monitoring fuel moistures in the East.

#### **Preparedness Level**

Resource ordering and UTFs have decreased considerably.

NOPS and NR continuing to trend downwards.

Recommend decreasing to PL3 at 0730 on 9/12. -Support

#### **Aviation**
