PL3, light IA, 101 new starts, 38 uncontained large fires, 16 CIMTs, 6 Army Medevac helicopters, 310 crews, 639 engines, 77 helicopters, 14,800 personnel assigned.

North Ops: PL3, 7 new starts, 5 uncontained large fires, 1 CIMT.

Blue – CA Team 6, managing Dillon and Log, minimal behavior, grass and timber, 3,666 acres, 30% contained. Ookala – Minimal behavior, litter and grass, structures threatened, 468 acres, 80% contained.

Northwest: PL4, light IA, 17 uncontained large fires, 11 CIMTs.

Bear Gulch – Extreme behavior, timber, active perimeter, structures threatened, evacuations, 17,000 acres, 10,800 acres, 9% contained.

Weather Summary (Gina McGuire)

WEATHER SUMMARY

Short-term (through Friday)

- · Warming and drying across the Northwest, Great Basin and Rockies.
- Increasing remnant tropical moisture in California, Southwest and western Great Basin with cooler temperatures, increased RH and light to moderate rainfall.
- Mixed wet/dry lightning in northern California, western/northern Nevada and southern Oregon Thu/Fri with increased initial attack.
- Hot and dry from the southern Plains across much of the East aside from isolated thunderstorms in the Southeast and continued widespread showers and thunderstorms in the Plains/Mississippi Valley
- · Showers and thunderstorms in the Mid-Atlantic, Southern New England today and Florida this week.

Long-term (Saturday through next Friday)

- Warm and dry in the Intermountain West Thursday.
- Potential for remnant tropical moisture moves into the West later through this weekend for an increase in mixed wet/dry thunderstorms that could increase initial attack and bring wetting rain.
- Showers and thunderstorms in the Plains will move east toward the Great Lakes and Mississippi and Ohio Valleys into next week.
- Warmer and drier from the Northeast through the Mid-Atlantic and Southeast with showers and thunderstorms in Florida.

Mixed wet/dry lightning in parts of California, Great Basin and Northwest this week with gusty wind potential in the Northwest, northern Great Basin and northern Rockies this weekend.

Fuels Summary (Ali Reiner)

Current fire danger indices show AZ and NM PSAs all at of below 50th percentile ERC.

NR ERCs are average with expected winds.

NOPS will see a drying trend.

SOPS fuel moisture is moderate with strong tropical moisture predicted for Thursday and Friday.

SA gulf coast is drying with potential moisture early next week.

RISK (Rick Stratton)

Bear Gulch is now largest fire in history on the Olympic Peninsula.

NW is busy and will have continued fire activity.

SOPS will continue to see a reduction in fire activity.

NICC Jet

Interagency resource funded by the FS.

All FS aviation costs have been transitioned to suppression funds except for the NICC Jet, which is funded through preparedness.

Data from 2014-2025 has shown steady utilization decline with a drastic increase in cost.

Expired contracts will have no authority to be extended after January 1.

GSA and large airlines provide opportunity for chartering personnel through bidding. Estimate \$400k round trip for 100 personnel.

Concern with quick transport for large numbers of people via commercial flights.

NMAC Business Rules must allow for moving resources outside of commercial airfare.

Recommend exploring additional options.

Consider added benefits of transporting one crew at a time rather than large groups to ease logistical lifts by spreading things out.

FS aviation reached out to AFS to discuss concerns.
