IMSR Update (Sean Peterson)

PL2, light IA, 182 new starts, 23 uncontained large fires, 6 CIMTs, 6 Army Medevac helicopters, 171 crews, 356 engines, 52 helicopters, 8,950 personnel assigned.

North Ops: PL3, light IA, 2 uncontained large fires.

Blue – Minimal behavior, grass, 3,700 acres, 83% contained.

Dillon – Minimal behavior, grass, 11,900 acres, 90% contained.

Northwest: PL3, light IA, 13 uncontained large fires, 5 CIMTs.

Lower Sugarloaf – NW Team 2, managing Labor Mountain, extreme behavior, timber, residences threatened, evacuations, 31,000 acres, 27% contained.

Labor Mountain – Active behavior, timber, residences threatened, evacuations, 17,200 acres, 7% contained.

Wildcat – Active behavior, timber, structures threatened, 9,500 acres, 7% contained.

Bear Gulch – Moderate behavior, timber, structures threatened, evacuations, 20,000 acres, 5% contained.

Crown Creek – WA DNR, NR Team 6, managing Katy Creek, minimal behavior, timber and brush, residences threatened, 14,192 acres, 93% contained.

Katy Creek – Minimal behavior, timber and brush, structures threatened, evacuations, 4,680 acres, 62% contained.

Lynx Mountain – SA Team 3, managing Rattlesnake, active behavior, brush, residences threatened, evacuations, 9,100 acres, 56% contained.

Rattlesnake – Minimal behavior, light fuels and timber, residences threatened, 21,845 acres, 96% contained. Moon Complex – NW Team 13, moderate behavior, timber, structures threatened, 4,750 acres, 10% contained. Emigrant – RM Team 1, minimal behavior, slash and timber, infrastructure threatened, 32,700 acres, 41% contained.

South Ops: PL3, light IA, 1 uncontained large fire.

Garnet – Minimal behavior, timber, 59,844 acres, 99% contained.

Northern Rockies: PL3, light IA, 3 uncontained large fires, 1 CIMT.

Windy Rock – Minimal behavior, grass and timber, 6,050 acres, 68% contained.

White Pine – NR Team 3 TOC local unit tomorrow, managing Island Creek, moderate behavior, timber, 1,050 acres, 78% contained.

Island Creek – Moderate behavior, timber, structures threatened, 14,900 acres, 7% contained.

Great Basin: PL2, 2 new starts, 1 uncontained large fire.

Dollar Lake – Moderate behavior, timber, 19,400 acres, 66% contained.

Southern Area: PL1, 33 new starts, 1 uncontained large fire.

Bluff Creek – Southern rough, 337 acres, 60% contained.

Tango Forty Four – 761 acres, 100% contained.

Southwest: PL1, no new starts, 2 uncontained large fires.

Predictive Services Update

Weather Summary (Jim Wallmann)

WEATHER SUMMARY

Short-term (through Sunday)

- Dry/breezy westerly winds in the eastern Cascades and Columbia Basin today creating elevated to critical
 conditions, with elevated activity expected on the Washington Cascades fires
- Warm/dry for the northern half of the West through the weekend with low RH, and locally breezy winds in portions of Montana
- A cold front brings relief to the Northeast today with widespread wetting rain before dry conditions return this
 weekend
- Dry on the Plains through the period with slow drying of fuels
- Two tropical storms off the East Coast by the weekend, and the impacts to the Southeast and Mid-Atlantic are
 uncertain. Higher surf and scattered showers and thunderstorms are the most likely impact at this time.

Long-term (next Monday through next Saturday)

- A deep upper-level trough will bring widespread precipitation to the northern half of the West, with snow in the higher elevations, and this appears to be a season-ending event for much of northern California, the Northwest, northern Great Basin, and northern Rockies west of the Divide
- Warm and dry on the Plains, with a period of breezy/dry winds on portions of the southern Plains next week which may create elevated conditions
- Continued dry from the Great Lakes to the Northeast, with breezy/dry northwest winds likely mid-next week in New England, with the impact somewhat mitigated by today's rain but it will accelerate the drying process
- Showers/thunderstorms may continue in the Southeast and Mid-Atlantic along with potential strong winds depending on the track of the tropical systems early next week



Showers and thunderstorms from Tropical Storm Humberto possible in the northeast. Season-ending event likely in the NW and NOPS.

SOPS may receive some precipitation, still expecting Santa Ana wind events.

Wind event in New England mid-next week.

Fuels Summary (Steve Larrabee)

No significant fire danger concerns in the US.

Drying fuels will be seen in NW, NOPS, and NR.

ERCs east of the Cascades have jumped back up into the 97th percentile prior to moderating conditions.

Below normal fire danger persists in SOPS.

Recent/impending improvement in parts of SA and EA.

Dry and breezy conditions amid dryer fuels in NW and NOPS.

Notable increase in fire danger in NR, east of the Divide.

Western portions of Southern Area also drying, with no precipitation expected.

New England will see some precipitation for short-term improvements.
