IMSR Update (Sean Peterson)

PL2, light IA, 150 new starts, 12 uncontained large fires, 3 CIMTs, 4 Army Medevac helicopters, 114 crews, 253 engines, 42 helicopters, 6,500 personnel assigned.

North Ops: PL2, light IA, 1 new start, 2 uncontained large fires.

Blue – Minimal behavior, light fuels and timber, received precipitation, 3,700 acres, 83% contained. Dillon – Minimal behavior, light fuels and timber, received precipitation, 11,900 acres, 95% contained.

Northwest: PL2, 2 new starts, 8 uncontained large fires, 3 CIMTs, received precipitation on most incidents. Lower Sugarloaf – NW Team 10, moderate behavior, received precipitation, timber and brush, residences threatened, evacuations, 39,594 acres, 48% contained.

Labor Mountain – NW Team 12, moderate behavior, timber, residences threatened, 37,650 acres, 7% contained. Wildcat – Moderate behavior, timber and brush, structures threatened, 14,500 acres, 5% contained.

Lynx Mountain – Active behavior, brush and timber, 9,350 acres, 80% contained.

Bear Gulch – Minimal behavior, timber, structures threatened, evacuations, 20,185 acres, 5% contained.

Moon Complex – NW Team 7, minimal behavior, received precipitation, timber litter, structures threatened, 18,300 acres, 10% contained.

Emigrant – Minimal behavior, received precipitation slash and timber, infrastructure threatened, 33,100 acres, 52% contained.

Northern Rockies: PL2, 1 uncontained large fires.

Windy Rock – MT DNR, minimal behavior, grass and timber, 6,175 acres, 82% contained.

Great Basin: PL1, 2 new starts, 1 uncontained large fire.

Lake Creek – Minimal behavior, light fuels and timber, 510 acres, 44% contained.

WEATHER SUMMARY

Short-term (through Monday)


- Continued wet in the northern half of the West through Saturday, with the heaviest rainfall from the central Sierra to central Idaho and along the Montana/Wyoming border
- Breezy for the Great Basin, central Rockies, and Southwest, strongest Friday, but recent precipitation will keep conditions mitigated with only localized areas of concern
- Well above normal temperatures for the Plains to Great Lakes into the weekend, with breezy southerly winds bringing areas of elevated conditions to the northern Plains and Minnesota Friday/Saturday and southern Plains this weekend
- · Continued dry in the Northeast and Mid-Atlantic, but winds will be light
- Low RH in the Lower Mississippi Valley and Southeast into tomorrow before RH increases this weekend with scattered showers likely early next week

Long-term (Tuesday through next Saturday)

- Moderate confidence in wetting rain for most areas from the Mid-Mississippi/Ohio Valleys into the Northeast Tuesday/Wednesday
- The dry pattern in the West continues Tuesday, but then very low confidence for mid to late next week due to
 models out of phase with a position of a trough from 135°W to the Intermountain West
- · Significant uncertainty carries into the Plains and eastern US as well mid to late next week
