WEATHER SUMMARY

Short-term (through Friday)

- Breezy/dry southwest winds in the Northeast through tomorrow with locally elevated conditions before at least modest relief arrives Tuesday night with rain along a cold front
- Light rain in the Great Lakes today, followed by dry conditions for the Midwest, with minimum RH falling to 20-35% Wednesday through Friday
- Above normal temperatures will develop across the Intermountain West late this week, but winds overall will be light
- Light precipitation west of the Cascades Wednesday/Thursday, increasing Friday, with scattered showers and thunderstorms moving into the Southwest and central Rockies late this week
- Remaining dry for much of Oklahoma and Texas this week, but winds are light to moderate and RH will remain elevated before dropping Friday

Long-term (Saturday through next Wednesday)

- Windy for the Plains to Mid/Upper Mississippi Valley this weekend, with elevated to critical conditions possible across portions of Oklahoma and Texas
- · Wet across most of the West this weekend with high elevation snow, but central California will see little rainfall
- An upper-level low near the East Coast will bring moderate to heavy rain to much of the Mid-Atlantic this
 weekend, with some rain into southern New England, but northern New England will remain dry
- Dry this weekend into next week for much of the Lower Mississippi Valley, Southeast, and southern Appalachians but winds will be mostly light
