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## IMSR Update (Sean Peterson)

PL1, light IA, 101 new starts, 6 uncontained large fires, 34 engines, 9 crews 550 personnel assigned.

### North Ops: PL1

Mana Road – HI, FWS, light fuels, 2,100 acres, 60% contained.

### South Ops: PL2, light IA.

Sage – Minimal behavior, timber and light fuels, 260 acres, 60% contained.

### Southern Area: PL2, light IA.

Bald Mountain – Active behavior, litter and slash, residences threatened, 1,648 acres, 52% contained.

Lignite – Litter and slash, 174 acres, 94% contained.

### Eastern Area: PL1, 27 new starts.

Woodside – Minimal behavior, timber and brush, structures threatened, 100 acres, 61% contained.

### Southwest: PL1, light IA.

Stanford – AZ, minimal behavior, timber and grass, 306 acres, 65% contained.



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## Predictive Services Update

### Weather Summary (Jim Wallmann)

#### WEATHER SUMMARY

##### Short-term (through Friday)

- Breezy/dry north to northwest winds creating elevated to critical conditions and high-risk significant fire potential for the northern Gulf Coast today
- Tomorrow, breezy/dry southwest winds will bring elevated to critical conditions and high-risk significant fire potential southern Plains
- Lighter winds are expected across much of the Southern Area midweek, with southerly winds returning to the southern High Plains Friday which may create elevated to critical conditions
- Warm in the West early this week, with a strong atmospheric river to bring widespread precipitation to the West Coast and much of the Intermountain West late Wednesday onward
- Light snow in the central Appalachians today, with locally elevated conditions possible on the east slopes of the Appalachians Tuesday into Wednesday due to breezy northwest winds in areas that receive little precipitation over the weekend

##### Long-term (Saturday through next Wednesday)

- Relief due to widespread wetting precipitation is likely for the southern Plains into the Lower Mississippi Valley this weekend into early next week
- Additional relief is possible for the Appalachians early next week, but portions of the east slopes may be shadowed
- Cool in the West, with another round of precipitation for the northern half of the West early next week



### Fuels Summary (Steve Larrabee)

Continued drying in portions of the southeast and southern California.

Monitoring Texas and Oklahoma for significant fire potential.

Today and tomorrow will likely be this week's most consequential days with regard to fire danger and potential. Freezing temperatures in much of the Southeast, plus parts of the Southwest deserts.

Current and short-term forecast Burning Index values are above the 97<sup>th</sup> percentile in parts of the Gulf Coast, Front Range, and interior Southern California.

BI is expected to trend down in almost all areas as RH improves and winds abate.

Hawaii fire danger and fuels conditions - Mana Road fire on east flank of Mauna Kea not expecting critical fire weather conditions the next couple of days. Breezy to locally strong trades will continue across the state through much of the week, but low-level moisture embedded within the trades should help to keep relative humidity from reaching critical thresholds.
