**Stockton Hill**, Northwest District, Arizona DOF. Ten miles north of Kingman, AZ. Grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping and smoldering. Structures and communication infrastructure threatened. Area, road and trail closures in effect. Reduction in acreage due to more accurate mapping.

**Pilot**, Northwest District, Arizona DOF. Twenty miles east of Wikieup, AZ. Grass and brush. Active fire behavior with uphill runs, wind-driven runs and flanking. Structures threatened.

**Brushy**, Socorro District, New Mexico State Forestry. Thirty miles south of Animas, NM. Grass and brush. Moderate fire behavior with creeping and smoldering.

**Beehive**, Coronado NF, USFS. Eight miles southwest of Carmen, AZ. Grass and brush. Minimal fire behavior with creeping, backing and smoldering.

**West Main**, Central District, Arizona DOF. Seven miles northeast of Yuma, AZ. Brush. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Area closures in effect.

**Three Lakes**, Kaibab NF, USFS. Previously reported incident. Five miles south of Jacob Lake, AZ. Grass and timber. Moderate fire behavior with backing, flanking and spotting. Structures threatened. Last narrative report unless significant activity occurs.

**Ridge**, Kaibab NF, USFS. Previously reported incident. Eight miles southeast of Tusayan, AZ. Timber. Moderate fire behavior with flanking and backing. Structures threatened. Last narrative report unless significant activity occurs.

**Hull**, Kaibab NF, USFS. Previously reported incident. Eleven miles east of Tusayan, AZ. Timber. Minimal fire behavior with smoldering. Structures threatened. Last narrative report unless significant activity occurs.

## **Predictive Services Discussion:**

Dry and windy conditions will continue across parts of southeast California, the southern Great Basin, western Colorado, and northern portions of the Southwest leading to elevated and critical fire weather conditions. Hot, dry, and unstable conditions will continue across parts of the Desert Southwest and Pacific Northwest. Isolated dry thunderstorms are possible in far northern California into southern Oregon, southern and central Idaho, and northern Nevada as well as in the north Cascades into northwest Montana. Isolated to scattered thunderstorms are likely in much of the Rockies, along and east of the Divide, while severe thunderstorms are likely on much of the central Plains into portions of the northern and southern Plains. Scattered to widespread thunderstorms are expected along the Gulf Coast through much of the Southeast, Mid-Atlantic, eastern Great Lakes, and Northeast. Scattered showers will spread across much of Alaska, but parts of southeast Alaska, including the panhandle, will remain warmer and drier.
