Predictive Services Discussion:

A cold front will move offshore in the Northeast and slowly push south into the Ohio Valley and Mid-Atlantic today. Isolated to scattered showers and thunderstorms are likely near the front from the eastern Dakotas through the Missouri and Ohio Valleys and in the Northeast. Some of the thunderstorms could be drier with gusty winds in the Northeast, and dry and breezy post-frontal conditions are expected across much of the Great Lakes into the Mid-Atlantic. Dry and windy conditions are also expected across portions of the southern Great Basin and much of Arizona. Isolated to scattered thunderstorms and showers will continue from central and northern California through southern Oregon and the northern Great Basin. Much of the Rockies and High Plains will have showers and thunderstorms develop, including potentially heavy rain and severe thunderstorms in the southern Rockies and southern High Plains. Isolated to scattered thunderstorms are likely from the Gulf Coast into Texas and Southeast as well. Warm and dry conditions will continue across eastern portions of Alaska.
