Predictive Services Discussion:

Dry and windy weather will develop across the Southwest, southern Great Basin, and West Slope today ahead of a strong late-season cold front. Moderate to high-risk significant fire potential is forecast, especially across the lower elevations of Arizona and New Mexico. Very hot temperatures, in some places exceeding 110°F, will continue across much of Texas today along with low relative humidity below 20%. Warm and dry conditions will build over the Great Lakes with minimum relative humidity below 35% and moderate significant fire potential. Well below normal temperatures are forecast along the West Coast into much of the Intermountain West, with showers, falling as snow above 6,000 feet, in the Northwest and northern Rockies. A stalled cold front will bring widespread showers and thunderstorms to the Southeast, southern Appalachians, and Mid-Atlantic, with heavy rain and flooding in portions of the Southeast and southern Appalachians.
